Here it is, a New Yearl Please consider a few additions to any resolutions you have already made. These are things wise and successful people do in and out of the Church.

Brother Jess Root Lived to be 107



Jess H Root, age 107, passed away on December 30, 2013 at his home in Mesa. He was surrounded by his daughter, Linette Morris (Dwight), sons Barry (Colleen) and Glen (Susan) along with many grandchildren and great-grandchildren. Rowena, his wife, preceded him in death in 2010.

Jess was born in Pima, Arizona on December 13, 1906. He had fond memories growing up in the Gila Valley.

He served 4 years in the National Guard of Arizona and 5 years in the Army. He was in Army intelligence in World War II on the Okinawa Island. Due to his intelligence work, a Japanese gun that was destroying any ship that came into the harbor was located and taken out. Many lives were saved.

Jess loved baseball and played for the University of Arizona and then semi-pro ball traveling the Southwest.

Upon his return and honorable release from the Army, he noticed a young lady by the name of Rowena Root. She was planning on serving a mission for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latterday Saints. He had other plans, but put his plans on hold while Rowena served that mission. Upon her return, he asked her to marry him and she accepted. They were married on June 4, 1947. They had three children Sara Linette, Jess Barry and Glen Harvey.

Jess graduated from Eastern Arizona College in Thatcher, AZ. Received degrees from University of Arizona, Northern Arizona University, and University of Denver. He earned five degrees from Associate to PHDs.

He managed a medical laboratory in Phoenix and then went to work for the Indian Hospital from 1970 - 1984 in Phoenix. He retired from the Indian Hospital as a lab technician at the age of 72. He was forced to retire when the new director found out his age.

He served as a bishop for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. During this time he walked out of the building on a Sunday and was shot in the shoulder, due to a scuffle that was going on outside.

He and his wife, Rowena, served as temple workers in the Arizona Temple of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. He retired at age 100.



He is survived by his 3 children, their spouses, 19 grand children and 47 great-grandchildren with 4 more coming. Brother Root was the oldest member of Dana Ward, having moved in in 2001. We all were privileged to hear him bare his testimony just a few weeks ago. He truly loved everyone in the Dana Ward.

In 2012 Jess was recognized by Gov. Jan Brewer during the state centennial celebration for being 105. He enjoyed telling people he was older than Arizona. He wasn't the oldest in the state, but he figures he was the oldest native of Arizona. He loved Arizona, his country and was so proud to be an American.

One thing Jess always worried about, was he did not want anyone to think he was stuck up because he didn't say Hi, he just couldn't see or hear. We will miss you Bro. Root.


Thanks again for all of your love and prayers! I am so thankful to have such a great family and ward to support me! I love you all and hope you all have great missionary experiences!

I am fine and all is well in Villa Alemana. I am inland about 45 minutes in car from Valpo. But the fire has destroyed so much. We were told to get our water together as they were going to cut the water until Tuesday but we have had water all day. The missionaries in that zone are all fine and from what I have heard, all of their possessions are alright and they are safe. The 2 zones and President Kahnlein were doing service Sunday afternoon. Also, part of the zone of Viña del Mar is helping. Until further notice, we won't be able to help and go and do service. Pres. Kahnlein will talk with the Stake Presidents to give us further direction. More than 10,000 people have been left homeless. It is true that the architecture there was just asking for a disaster. But there is nothing more that we can do for them besides praying and all the members and non-members here are coming together to send beds, clothing and water to the parts and families that have been affected. But Chile is a strong country and will be able to come back. From what I have heard, the fire is still going but they are getting it under control.

This has been making me think of how sneaky Satan is. We have had an earthquake recently, and now a fire. We don't know when the next earthquake will be or the next fire. Just as how we don't know when The Son of God will come again. Even He and the angels don't know the day in which He will come. But we do know that the Lord is hastening His work and that the day is coming soon. So what do we need to do? This week, we were able to see some good miracles! So on Friday, I had a training meeting and gave us our responsabilities as zone leaders and all that jazz and so I went back with Elder Esquivia and we put some goals on how we were going to improve. (His last companion had 6 weeks left in the mission and so he was trunky and a little rubbed off on my comp). So we put goals and then saw miracles.

Last night, I went on splits with a member of our branch to teach him and again, we taught him about what a testimony is and explained to him that he has learned A LOT with us and that he is just missing the spiritual confirmation. So at the end of the lesson we invited him to pray and the member invited him to ponder afterwards to recieve his answer. So he did that and then told us that he felt a peace inside. We let him know that was his answer and he proceeded to tell us that he had always felt that peace after praying to know. We told him that he had recieved his answer a long time ago and just didn't recgonize it! He now has a baptismal date for the 21st of June but we're going to baptize him in May! I am so excited for him!

We are going to be having a baptism this week on Wednesday of Jimmy. The miracle I sent you last week and he is awesome! He came to church yesterday and we told him to ponder about the Atonement while he partook of the sacrament and he started to pray and ponder. This kid is 10 years old and the most inteligent kid I have ever known. He is going to be a great missionary! It is such a great feeling to help others come unto Christ like this! I love it!! 

MISSIONARY SETTING-APART - A BIT UNUSUAL

My wife and I have sent off several of our children to serve missions and each missionary has been a blessing to our lives. We had a rather unique situation with our youngest daughter, Larissa, as she went off to serve her mission and that story is worth recording and sharing. She was to report to the MTC on July 9th, 2014.

We were a bit challenged with her missionary departure since we were then serving as Camp Directors of the Jack Nicol Cub Scout Camp – located in the northwest Colorado village of Red Feather Lakes – far from our Mesa, Arizona ward and home. Larissa served with us as a staff member for a month before her mission departure (and seemed to have a grand time there with us).

We talked to our Stake President about options for the setting apart. He read the handbook and even contacted the Church Missionary Department – to see if she could be set apart by a Colorado stake president, etc. He was informed that only her own stake president could perform the Priesthood action. This added some logistical challenges since, as the Camp Directors, we were unable to leave the camp. But, we made flight arrangements to make it all possible.

JULY 6TH - SUNDAY

I got up at 3:30 AM this morning to get ready to take Larissa to the airport. We kicked out the staff last night about 11 PM in anticipation of the very early departure this morning. I would have preferred to have slept longer – but I did still shower at that early hour – for the sake of others.

We left HQ at 4:06 AM. We headed with Larissa toward the Denver airport. She needed to be there about 6:15 AM. She needed to fly home to be set apart by our Stake President, Ray Johnson. He called Salt Lake church headquarters to explore other options but they were emphatic that it is him who needs to perform the action – and also noted that it must happen within five days of her date to enter the MTC. So, we complied with President's Johnson's request to get Larissa to him.

We enjoyed the trip to Denver though Larissa slept through much of it. There was one moment of drama en route, however. This was the final "passing of the batan" (so to speak) as Larissa officially gave up her cell phone (which has become so much of her). Lou took a couple of photos of the big moment. With trepidation, Larissa handed the phone over to Lou – who will become the official user and caretaker of

the phone as Larissa is gone. And that, in itself, is a historical milestone. Lou, the ultimate non-techie, now becoming a cell phone operator. Larissa gave her a few scant instructions on the phone use but basically left it to Lou to become self-trained.

So, we walked to the airport and it was with very mixed feelings and emotions that we walked her and her scant single piece of luggage into the terminal. All of the rest of her mission things have been packed into suitcases for a couple of months and will be waiting for Larissa as she gets to our house later tonight.

So, it was a sad moment as we, the old farts, said our goodbyes to our youngest and last daughter to leave the nest. There were many tears all around as we hugged and then hugged again. But, finally, it was that moment when we had to let go.

With teary eyes, we watched Larissa as she proceeded up through the security line. She turned back and we waved a couple of times. And then she was beyond our view. So, our little girl was off on a new 18-month adventure. She is our seventh missionary to serve and the good-byes do not get any easier.

And with Larissa gone, Lou and I now become official "Empty Nesters" – meaning we have no children "in the nest" at home. So, this will be a bit weird – since we have had children at home with us for 35 years! Wow! Now there is an interesting thought!

With Larissa having her set-apart session tonight, I changed the time of our camp orientation meeting for our Cub Scout leaders. We conducted the meeting at 4:30 PM. This worked okay. We then had flag ceremony at 5:15 PM. Lou and I got dinner "to go" and headed back to the HQ building – leaving Travis in charge at the dining hall.

It was our Stake President, Ray Johnson, who suggested that we connect electronically to the setting apart session. I put our son, Rusty, (much more a "techie" than I) in charge of getting a family connection set up through Zoom Cloud Meeting. He did get it arranged and we got the connection through the camp computer.

Larissa made it to Phoenix safely and our daughter, Jackie and family were there to get her at the airport. They got her to our ward and she attended the meetings there. She went home to finalize her suitcases. And after the meeting with the Stake President, she and all of the local family were invited to my Mother's place for dinner and fellowship.

At 5:00 PM (6:00 PM our Colorado camp time), Larissa was at the stake president's office. Rusty got us connected and via Zoom we could see that Mother, Dad, our neighbor/friends, the Hales, Rusty and Fabriza, Jackie and Michael, and Mike and

Marinda (another daughter) who were all there. Also, K.C. and Celeste (who live in Hurricane, Utah) – as well as Kaylea (whose family lives in Forest Grove, Oregon) were connected into the conference call with us. Some of our non-LDS staff – including Raina – came back as we were ready to join the blessing and she sat and listened to it. She thought that it was interesting (as a non-member).

President Johnson gave Sister Hunt a very nice blessing and she was very pleased with it. I think that my sister, Lesa, got a recording of the whole call. [But, to date, we have not seen it.] It was very cool that with technology – and even though nearly 1,000 miles away, we were still able to be a part of the gathering. Amazing and awesome!

FROM THE PERSONAL JOURNAL OF KEVIN V. HUNT

A SERIES OF MIRACLES REMIND US OF GOD'S LOVE

My wife and I had an interesting experience in the summer of 2014. I am a bus driver and my wife is a school teacher. So, we both have the summer free. And with a free summer, we signed on to be the Directors of a resident Cub Scout Camp near the small village of Red Feather Lakes – located west of the highway between Ft Collins, Colorado and Laramie, Wyoming. I was the Camp Director and Lou was the Program Director. We worked at the Jack Nicol Cub Scout Camp.

During the camp season, we took Webelos Scouts (ten year olds) and their parent – mostly dads (but a few moms) over to Camp Jeffrey, a Boy Scout camp located a mile or so away. We experienced a series of miracles on one of those excursions. I wrote the following journal entry about the miracles of that special day.

JULY 18, 2014 - FRIDAY

Each session of camp, I try to help youth to complete a Cub requirement to learn about and to begin writing a journal. I do this by telling of my own journal experience and by reading from my own journal.

This entry in my own journal is written to express sincere gratitude to the Lord for a series of miracles that all came together on behalf of the Webelos campers.

It has been frustrating each Webelos session to have to tell the campers that – for whatever unknown reason – we would not be offering canoeing to them. The canoeing program has been advertised in the advance website information about the camp. This news has come to all with major disappointment after many have worked very hard to obtain the needed swim test.

We have been able to appease people somewhat by offering a horse riding experience. Then this week the lady horse wranglers ditched out on me and did not come to our camp at all. This was an added disappointment for me as I knew the feelings of the campers. I have little contact with my boss, Brittney, the Ranch Manager for Camp Ben Delatour and she has never responded when I have left her a phone message.

Today, however, I called and left her a message expressing my frustration and disappointment in the "no-horse" situation. I thought that would be the end of the subject.

Then about 4:15 PM I received a very major surprise as Brittney talked to various Camp Jeffrey people on the radio and I heard her as she organized canoeing for my Webelos campers – and then later horses for us also. This really was a miracle. She called me on the radio and told me of the plan. I was in shock. I told her that I would have my sixty campers, parents and leaders there at 6:45 PM.

Then began a rush of excitement and many questions as I contemplated the welcome but major challenge ahead. How was I to communicate the new plan to my campers – and how would I get them there? Were we to drive – or were we to walk? I knew that driving would be a challenge to transport 100 people – and knew too, that the Jeffrey parking lot would be full with their record-breaking week of the summer. And with sixty boys, I did not want them all standing around waiting for their turns on the canoes and horses. I knew immediately that I needed a four-program rotation over there – but what else could we do for the boys?

I decided that I needed to sound our emergency bell to summon all staff and campers to the dining hall. I had never used this communication medium before this summer. But, at each leader meeting, I have told the folks that if they hear the bell at any time other than 7:00 AM, it is an emergency and that they should come to the dining hall immediately. Would that system work, I wondered?

I decided to give it a try and rang the bell long and loud at 4:45 PM just as the afternoon program rotation was ending. I went to the dining hall and the people began to pour in – all wondering what was the major emergency. All were curious and anxious.

I gave the Cub Scout sign and all were quiet in anticipation. I announced that we would indeed be given the opportunity to experience both canoeing and horse riding TONIGHT. There were cheers and applause from everyone. Excitement rose to a high. We then talked of options of how to implement the plan to get us all over the mountain. We had an immediate flag ceremony – early and without Class A uniforms

so that the boys and adults could go get ready for the coming adventure. We managed to get dinner served early. I had instructed all to meet after dinner at the west end of the dining hall – under the patio.

All gathered at the appointed hour and then it began to rain. I then heard the dread thunder. Thunder is a nightmare to all camp directors because it means that program is closing – and then comes the nightmare of what to do with everyone with the closing programs. And tonight it meant that after all of our work and excitement that there was a chance that it would all fall through – knowing that lake and horse programs always close at the first sound of thunder.

I went to the edge of the patio and looked up to heaven. I prayed fervently for a miracle. I prayed that the rain would stop, that the clouds would part and that we would still be able to have our planned program. It rained rather hard for a few minutes and then slowed down. We took a leap of faith and I sent my four organized patrol groups – each with a staff member – off toward the Jeffrey Camp.

We walked to the camp without rain on us. This was truly a miracle. Then as we were on the road heading from the Lion Lodge up toward the museum, I looked to the left and there was a brilliant and full rainbow above us – and above the lake. Wow! I knew that the Lord was truly blessing us, His sons (and a few daughters). It was so beautiful and unbelievable. Amazing!

We got to the lake and the four program areas all happened. Wow! It was amazing to see it all come together. Brittney was there with Zach, Greg, Micah, and lady wranglers Taylor and Holly. I watched with joy as the first group was loaded into the canoes. I heard the laughter of folks enjoying games with Sierra near the fishing ramada. I saw the kids having a grant time as they rode off on the horses. And it was truly amazing that another miracle came together with Lawrence Atlas, commissioner, who was able to arrange for us to experience Pellet gun shooting – for the first time ever for our Cub Scouts. Wow!

I was able to visit frequently with Dan Wright – a new friend and brother – as well as many other adults and boys.

I stood frequently at the top of the hill near the waterfront and marveled at the wonder of the whole scene. It was truly wonderful.

Then near the end of the evening, I stood in absolute awe of the sunset. And another Jeffrey staff member noticed it. This another miracle. The sun shown up above the mountains to the west in expansive rays that radiated up from the mountains to the sky. This came to me as a silent witness that God was indeed mindful of us and it

was His way of telling us that he had made everything possible for us. I looked at it in the spirit of rejoicing. I rejoiced in the miracles of the evening.

Another miracle was that the daylight lasted exactly long enough to get all four groups through all four program area. Wow! There was exactly enough sunlight and the canoes came in just as the light was gone.

We walked back to camp (though many people were in vehicles). We got back to camp safely and all was well.

Many of the Scouts and leaders decided to watch the movie, "Follow Me Boys" with us in the dining hall. The "techies" were able to get the computer and sound system to work. And Dan Wright knew how to work the camp popcorn maker and made popcorn for all of us to enjoy. This proved to be a fun activity – though only eight people made it through to the final end of the movie.

When I finally got to bed – right at 2:00 AM (after dining hall clean-up), I lay there a few moments reflecting on the many miracles of the evening and all that had come together to make it all possible. It was all truly a wonderful and marvelous combination of blessings unto us. I was very grateful to the Lord for his blessings upon us.





Just to let you know, I am fine and nothing happened from the earthquake. FYI, Chile is used to all of these earthquakes and so everything is built to withstand these seizures. A 6.4 would rock any state in the states, like the one that happened in Cali yesterday, but here, the majority of the people called it a tremor or a seizure but not an earthquake. So we were in a house while it happened and everything started to shake and the whole family ran to the door. Some things fell over and some papers but nothing crazy.

We also had a baptism! This baptism was very simple and we almost didn't have to do anything. We just got to the church and filled up the font and the dad and the Ward Mission Leader took care of the rest. We had to make sure everything was open and all that and listo! He got baptized! And afterward, his family had prepared some refreshments and it was great! That all ended at about 3 and we usually eat lunch with the members at 1:30. But because the baptism went so long, we didn't start lunch until 4:15. It was crazy! But we were able to go visit come people before lunch.

BYU Football: Top 10 One Hit Wonders Ray Crandall

Position: Left Defensive Tackle Year 1971

In the matter of a few months, Ray Crandall went from expecting to be drafted into the U.S. Armed Forced to serve in Vietnam to cutting wood for a summer job to starting defensive lineman. The BYU defense needed to replace some starters on the defensive line for the 197 season. Crandall was a "definite starter" his junior year according to the media guide for that season, but his contributions were not expected to be as much as Keith Rivera. In the season outlook, the media guide specifically mentioned Rivera and Earl Burrell as replacements who would "strengthen [the defense] with each game."

Crandall had been at BYU since 1969. He redshirted in 1969 and was considered a semi-regular in 1970. While his play in 1970 helped earn him a starting spot the following year, the 6-foot-3, 225 pound left defensive tackle didn't do enough to inspire confidence that he could fill the void left by Gerald Meyer or Mike Jacobsen-at least not like 6-foot-2, 217 pound outstanding freshman Rivera.

By season's end, Crandall had 121 tackles (35 solo) and 8 tackles-for-loss. He was third on the team for tackles and tied for third in TFL. Rivera had 53 tackles (12 solo) and 8 TFL. Crandall was a key piece of a defense that finished the season second in the WAC in stopping the

themselves. They need help from a friend, the Elder quarm, bishop, neighbors, and so many others. With all this help they are able to get him baptized.


So, we learned from this activity that we need help from members all the time. If we don't have that then it is hard to have someone stay on date. As well as to help them to stay active in the church once the elders leave.

This is a valuable tool which can make communications easier and faster. If you have a personal computer you are strongly encouraged to go online and get signed up, if you haven't done so. I am very thankful, that for the most part, most of us in America still celebrate the birth of the Lord at this time of year.




