Dear Members of the Dana Ward,

Elder Dallin H Oaks, in General Conference, October 1999, said: "Our concern with gospel teaching is not limited to those who are called to teach in the priesthood quorums, Primary, Relief Society, Sunday School, Young Women, and in other assignments. In the Lord's great plan of salvation there are no more important teachers than parents, who teach their children constantly by example and by precept. Each of us teaches those around us by example. Even children teach one another. Every missionary is a teacher. And every leader is a teacher".

The Church goes to a lot of effort to prepare the manuals that we teach from. There are many revisions before the approved version is released. Each manual is reviewed in depth by the Quorum of the Twelve.

There are many different ways to teach, but all good teaching is based on certain fundamental principles.

The *first* is love. It has two manifestations. When we are called to teach, we should accept our calling and teach because of our love for God the Eternal Father and His Son, Jesus Christ.

Second, a gospel teacher, like the Master we serve, will concentrate entirely on those being taught.

Third, a superior teacher of the gospel will teach from the prescribed course material, with greatest emphasis on teaching the doctrine and principles and covenants of the gospel of Jesus Christ. Elder Oaks, in a Worldwide training session, emphasized that we do not have the right to deviate from the lesson or

teach our own lesson.

Fourth, a gospel teacher will prepare diligently and strive to use the most effective means of presenting the prescribed lessons. The new *Teaching the Gospel* manual and the new Teacher Improvement Meetings are obviously intended to assist teachers in this effort.

The *fifth* fundamental principle of gospel teaching is the Lord's command, that gospel teachers should "teach the principles of my gospel . . . as they shall be directed by the Spirit. . . . And if ye receive not the Spirit ye shall not teach" (D&C 42:1214). It is a gospel teacher's privilege and duty to seek that level of discipleship where his or her teachings will be directed and endorsed by the Spirit rather than being rigidly selected and prearranged for personal convenience or qualifications. The marvelous principles of "Gospel Teaching and Leadership" in the new *Church Handbook of Instructions* include the following: "Teachers and class members should seek the Spirit during the lesson. A person may teach profound truths, and class members may engage in stimulating discussions, but unless the Spirit is present, these things will not be powerfully impressed upon the soul. . . .

That leads to the *sixth* and final principle." A gospel teacher is concerned with the results of his or her teaching, and such a teacher will measure the success of teaching and testifying by its impact on the lives of the learners.

L. Tom Perry said: "Learn to ask, seek and knock spiritually; to teach from the scriptures; to teach by the Spirit; to help the learner assume responsibility for learning; and to never leave a class without bearing your witness and testimony of the truthfulness of what you've taught."

As we strive to enhance and improve our teaching at home or in church, may our lessons be in accordance with the Lord's will. 'Thank You', to all of our ward instructors for your dedication, time and efforts in fulfilling your callings. Love, Dwight Morris

Hola Me Familia,

I was transferred from Jardin America to Barranqueras, just outside downtown Resistencia and I love serving here. We are really close to the Mission Office. I miss JA because we were ready to baptize the whole Alvarenga Family and I miss Elder Andrus who was a great companion. It was also cooler there, with shade trees and breezes. Resistencia is completely flat and there is no shade and so far, no breezes to cool our 110 degree heat and a ton of humidity. My new comp is Elder Aguilar from Buenos Aires and my first Latino companion. He has been in the mission for 10 months and I really like him. I am feeling so much more confident in my Spanish skills.

This week has been great! I have never worked so hard in my life! We are trying to find some good investigators. We had a lesson Friday evening with the Lemos family we have been teaching for a few weeks. We taught them about the Plan of Salvation and something significantly changed in me. I felt the Spirit stronger than I ever have before in my life. I was talking and testifying and I don't even know what came out of my mouth. After the lesson, Elder Andrus told me he thought I did well. Elder Rhode told me I would learn so much more from my 2nd companion and he is definitely right. Besides learning the language and teaching methods from him, I think I am turning into a responsible and respectful human being!

We had such a good service at Church on Sunday. I've never seen so many members since arriving here in Argentina. The ward is excited that the Valesquez family will be going to the temple after the end of January, which is their "one year mark" as members. They will finally be sealed together for all time and eternity. I wore my gold watch to meetings that same day and almost every ward member came up to me and complimented me on the watch but warned me to be careful about wearing it because they were sure that someone would try to rob me. I made it safely back to our apartment and I won't be wearing it again while serving here.

We had to spend most of last Monday in our apartment because the owner of the building was drilling a big hole in one of our walls. Bet you can't guess what is going in that big hole in

the wall! AIR CONDITIONING! I am soooo happy! Now I will finally be able to sleep on our really hot and humid summer nights!

Today we had interviews with Pres. Del Castillo and I told him in my interview that I am related to Pres. Dan Udall of the Paraguay Asuncion Temple, through Pat. He said that Pres. Udall comes to every stake conference, so I will definitely get to meet him at our next Stake Conf, no matter where I am assigned at that time.

I have been working hard on Chapter 4 of *Preach my Gospel*, about how to recognize the Spirit and teach with it. I love it and I testify that this church is true, sin ninguna duda (without a doubt). I love you all and you are in my prayers. Elder Oldner
