I have moved to Macau which is a peninsula about 30 miles west of Hong Kong. It's pretty much a tourist mecca. Our apartment is on the top (6th) floor, which we are enjoying. We go back to Hong Kong about once a week for zone meetings and conferences and we go to the temple. We travel there on a turbo boat that lifts out of the water on skis.
