When the Gen. Conference tapes came, it was like Christmas for us here in Argentina! My favorite two talks were by Jeffrey R. Holland and M. Russell Ballard. To see the Book of Mormon that was with Joseph and Hyrum in Carthage Jail was amazing. Elder Ballard's special talk about Fathers and Sons was awesome.

I got hold of some kind of a bug that played havoc with my stomach last Saturday. I threw up all night. I think it might have been the cold pizza from our Zone Conference. I was supposed to go with my companion to conduct some baptism interviews, so I drank a glass of Pepto Bismal and felt much better afterwards. I felt like I had returned from the 'land of the dead'!

We have been helping an investigator couple get married and they are anxious to be baptized. We had 6 investigators in church on Sunday and have 3 baptisms planned before the end of October. We are going to celebrate this evening with 4 boys that were baptized last month. We are ordering pizza and it should be fun. It was so exciting to see all four of them passing the sacrament last Sunday.

I have enjoyed my companion so much. He is from Antofagasta, Chile and he is serious but also fun at the same time.

We are nearing the end of the month and it's a little rough as our monthly allowance has not arrived yet. Fortunately I still have some personal money but that is not the case with all of the Elders. Hope everyone at home is enjoying the cooling off temperatures. Our weather is really warming up here. I truly am glad to be here and the time is flying by. Hope all is well back in the Dana ward. One of my favorite investigators (shhh, we don't have favorites) was so excited to share some good news with us. His name is Juan Cortez and he recently visited his doctor and they were running tests, suspecting he might have Cancer. His tests are negative for Cancer and he is sure it is due to the Priesthood blessing we gave him after his first lesson with us. He offered to make breakfast for us. He is an awesome cook. He worked for 7 years as a restaurant chef. As a family, they are all involved right now with communion classes for his young son. But Juan has committed to attending our Sacrament Meetings every week before they have to head over to the Catholic Church for the communion classes. I was surprised and very pleased that all four of them have actually been showing up for our Sac. Meetings. His wife has been reading the Book of Mormon and has some doubts about her Catholic faith. I will also be training a brand new Elder from the MTC. This is my first and I am still working on fluency with my Spanish. This wasn't what I had wished for, but I am hopeful it will make me speed up my skills in several areas. Maybe I've been given this opportunity so I can learn and grow myself. Our entire Zone, area and district are reorganizing. We were all quite comfortable the way things were and change is always hard. It makes me nervous but our fears are somewhat modified by our faith that we can all meet our challenges and fill our responsibilities as missionaries.

This week I had an interesting challenge. I was riding my bike to the chapel and not paying good attention to my surroundings. A silver car zoomed right past me and hit a deep puddle near me. The end result was a thorough soaking. Water was dripping off my helmet. Half frozen and dripping wet, I continued on to the church where I arrived cold and soggy. I was pretty miserable but

remembered that I can never enjoy the good things of life if I have not experienced the lows. I changed my attitude since I couldn't change my clothes and made a joke of my soakage. Our lesson went well and I didn't get sick so I did receive some blessings from the experience.

We were so excited here in Guam to get to see the taped Gen. Conference broadcasts. Five new temples is exciting!

We had an exciting October with the local typhoon watch for this time of year. At one point, there were 4 Super Typhoons headed for our island, but one went South, one went North and two dissipated into tropical storms. All of them missed us. We had been notified by the Mission Office to stay inside and off the streets for our safety, for a few hours. Being unique to us, it was rather disappointing that we barely got any rain or wind at all. I think that every missionary was hoping to get to experience some kind of tropical storm but they passed us by. All in all, it was a different week for us but turned out to be very normal with only the usual amounts of high humidity.

We do each carry a cell phone here so the Office can always contact us for Church business or safety checks. They are paid for from mission funds and we are not allowed to make any long distance calls.

We will be working as a threesome, with one of the new missionaries for a short time until his travel arrangements can be completed for him to fly to Saipan (part of the Mariana Islands) where he has been assigned. It will be fun to get acquainted with him, even if for a short time. We have dropped our family of 9 we were working with as they were unable or unwilling to keep their appointments with us. The work is a little slow right now in our area.

I was disappointed to hear from a friend at home that he has decided to join the Air Force rather than turn in his mission papers. However, a missionary I came out with served in the Army for a few years before his mission. He said it allowed him some personal maturity time before he went on his mission and it worked well for him. I hope this proves true for my friend at home.

The humidity here is sure hard on my scriptures. All the tropical moisture has made my scriptures separate from the binding and they are literally falling apart. Otherwise, all is well here in Guam and the Gospel is True! Love, Elder Standage



How We Got Fast Sunday's

"Special fast days for various purposes were held during the exodus from Nauvoo, and after the Saints arrived in the Salt Lake Valley, some fasts were held on the first Thursday of the month. . . . During the difficult years of 1855 and 1856 in Utah, because of prolonged drought and famine, the exceptionally hard winter, and the plague of grasshoppers, many of the Saints were in desperate circumstances. This is what Brigham H. Roberts wrote of it:" "To meet the very great demands of charity upon Latter-day Saints in those trying years, our fast day came into existence; the servants of the Lord instituted the first Thursday in every month as fast day, with a view of taking what was saved by this sacrifice and minister unto those who otherwise would be in want. This plan

of meeting that emergency became an established institution.' (Conference Report, Apr. 1913, p. 120)
"Prior to this time the poor had been sustained by donations, but now the care of the poor became associated with fast day and what was donated became known as fast offerings, which were brought to the monthly fast meetings. From this early period when the Saints came to the valleys of the mountains to 1896, a regular fast day was held on the first Thursday of each month, and offerings were brought and given largely in kind." "Fast Day," Ensign, Nov. 1985, 73
