Dear Members of the Dana Ward,

These are trying times to say the least. It seems that if one does not have financial challenges, there are health issues, and if not health, then something else. So where do you look for guidance and comfort. Do you ever feel down and alone? Does depression set in like a monsoon rain? Do you ever get tired and feel like you need a rest from Church activities and responsibilities? I think everyone does. I know I do. Why don't we take time off from Church? All I need is a few weeks. But then a few weeks can become a few months and then a few years. If I stop doing what I know to be right, coming to Church, not wanting to home teach - all because "I am tired", "I need a break" or "the Lord doesn't need my service right now" - I allow Satan to get his foot in the door and fairly soon I may find myself on the wrong side of the door. Trying to retrench into our good habits may not be as easy as one might think.

If you are feeling overwhelmed, if you are feeling tired, depressed and want a break, consider the counsel of King Benjamin: "And behold, I tell you these things that ye may learn wisdom; that ye may learn that when ye are in the service of your fellow beings ye are only in the service of your God. Behold, ye have called me your king; and if I, whom ye call your king, do labor to serve you, then ought not ye to labor to serve one another?

And behold also, if I, whom ye call your king, who has spent his days in your service, and yet has been in the service of God, do merit any thanks from you, O how you ought to thank your heavenly King! I say unto you, my brethren, that if you should render all the thanks and praise which your whole soul has power to possess, to that God who has created you, and has kept and preserved you, and has caused that ye should rejoice, and has granted that ye should live in peace one with another—

I say unto you that if ye should serve him who has created you from the beginning, and is preserving

you from day to day, by lending you breath, that ye may live and move and do according to your own will, and even supporting you from one moment to another—I say, if ye should serve him with all your whole souls yet ye would be unprofitable servants. And behold, all that he requires of you is to keep his commandments; and he has promised you that if ye would keep his commandments ye should prosper in the land; and he never doth vary from that which he hath said; therefore, if ye do keep his commandments he doth bless you and prosper you. And now, in the first place, he hath created you, and granted unto you your lives, for which ye are indebted unto him.

And secondly, he doth require that ye should do as he hath commanded you; for which if ye do, he doth immediately bless you; and therefore he hath paid you. And ye are still indebted unto him, and are, and will be, forever and ever; therefore, of what have ye to boast? "(Mosiah 2:18-24)

Two of our greatest examples of those who forged ahead through difficult times and trials and who were faithful to the end were Jesus Christ and Joseph Smith.

If we are struggling, we need to turn to Christ and make him our rock and as Helaman 5:12 says:

"And now, my sons, remember, remember that it is upon the rock of our Redeemer, who is Christ, the Son of God, that ye must build your foundation; that when the devil shall send forth his mighty winds, yea, his shafts in the whirlwind, yea, when all his hail and his mighty storm shall beat upon you, it shall have no power over you to drag you down to the gulf of misery and endless wo, because of the rock upon which ye are built, which is a sure foundation, a foundation whereon if men build they cannot fall.

May we be valiant, diligent in our callings and push on with faith in every footstep to the end of life, is my prayer.

Dear Dana Ward - We feel like the work is going very well here in spite of the intense summer heat. We had 2 baptisms on Saturday and increased our investigator's pool to 34. Dear Family & Ward -

Things are generally pretty great here in Pohnpei. The new language is coming pretty good. I have the first of the 4 part stages passed off and am able to teach a little bit, which feels good. The members are such a great help. One of them asked me yesterday, if I needed help with anything at all. It is so nice to have their support! Things are good in that department! We got transfer calls last night and I am staying here in Mand with Elder Larson and I learned that Elder Parker, my old companion from Mesa, is being assigned to our district also. That will be fun!

A couple of weeks ago, we were able to baptize Weltrick Tihpen, my first baptism in Pohnpeian. Because he had attended so many Sacrament Meetings, he was able to be baptized a week earlier than had first been planned. He is from a part-member family. A few of his brothers are members but they are all less active and don't seem to have much interest in the Church right now. We found Weltrick when we were out tracting one day and it was so neat when he told us he had an answer to his study and prayers and has progressed rapidly in his understanding. He was ordained into the priesthood this last week. We also had a baptism back in Dec. and he is so happy and changed since receiving the Holy Ghost. On Saturday, I baptized someone for the sister missionaries. This was a unique experience because the baptism took place in a river. We all felt the Spirit very strong.

Seeing how hard it is for our local members to attend the temple with the long distance involved, I often think of the blessings of our temple so close there in Mesa. I think that going to the temple will be one of the first things I want to do when I return home. I hope you are all attending the temple regularly.

I am trying to avoid looking like a tourist but I am taking lots of pictures. I want to be able to remember so many things when I come home. I have been looking for an English/Pohnmeian dictionary. As I remember those, it's like a normal rainy day here and then after it stops raining it dries up in about 20 minutes, max!


Hello,
