

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We recently had a lesson in our Priest Quorum in which I was able to reflect on how hard it is at times, for us to get to the Temple. The adversary does not want us there and it seems that many obstacles are placed in our path when we plan to go. Many times when I have planned to attend the Temple, distractions seemed to appear out of nowhere and reasons to cancel or postpone my attendance would abound. Often these choices were between two or more "good things". In spite of all the distractions, when I finally made it to the Temple, I was ALWAYS so happy to be there. The reasons for not going seemed to be insignificant. There was peace and comfort in knowing that I had made the correct choice. I knew there were blessings that would be received for myself and those I was concerned about. My testimony of the truthful-



ness of the Gospel is ALWAYS strengthened when I go to the Temple.

Elder Dean L Larson of the Seventy is quoted as saying; "So often we relate the temples to the vicarious ordinances that are performed there for those who are deceased. Certainly this is a vital part of temple work. But there is another aspect of temple activity that has great importance for living members. I refer not only to the ordinances performed for the living but as well to the spiritually uplifting, strengthening influence in individual lives that results from regular temple attendance.

President Ezra Taft Benson has affirmed: "Many parents, in and out of the Church, are concerned about protection against a cascading avalanche of wickedness which threatens to engulf [the world]. ... There is a power associated with ordinances of heaven—even the power of godliness—which can and will thwart the forces of evil if we will but be worthy of those sacred covenants made in the temple of the Lord. Our families will be protected, our children will be safeguarded as we live the gospel, visit the temple, and live close to the Lord."

Elder Boyd K. Packer has said, "Our labors in the temple cover us with a shield and a protection, both individually and as a people." He has also added: "The Lord will bless us as we attend to the sacred ordinance work of the temples. Blessings there will not be limited to our temple service. We will be blessed in all of our affairs. We will be eligible to have the Lord take an interest in our affairs both spiritual and temporal."

President Gordon B. Hinckley said, "I am satisfied that if our people would attend the temple more, there would be less of selfishness in their lives. There would be less of absence of love in their relationships. There would be more of fidelity on the part of husbands and wives. There would be more of love and peace and happiness in the homes of our people".

In a few months our Pueblo Stake Center will serve as an extension of the Temple. Dedication of the Gila Valley Temple will take place in three sessions broadcast on Sunday May 23, 2010. Our normal church block will <u>not</u> be held. Instead, worthy members eight years of age and older will have the opportunity to receive a special Temple Recommend to attend one of the dedicatory sessions. No one will be admitted unless they have received a recommend. It is my hope that Dana Ward members will prepare for this great event. Please keep yourself clean, pay your tithing, be honest, attend your meetings and do all that is necessary to be worthy to attend. We all need the blessings of the Temple, and now is the time to prepare for a wonderful spiritual renewal.

# Missionary Mailbox

Elder Caleb T. Oldner (Argentina, Resistencia Mission) AV. Rivadavia 323 Resistencia, Chaco Argentina

Dear Dana Ward – I am completing my 7th month here in my area in Resistencia. I have enjoyed it here, but I am hoping I will get one last transfer on March 10th and get to learn a new area. My Companion is still Elder Zimmerman. He has been in the mission field for 5 and ½ months now. His language skills are very good because he knew French and a lot of the language rules were the same as in Spanish. We have a lot of fun discussions on Gospel Principals and are learning from each other. He has been sharing the addresses of his girlfriends at home so I can write them and will have some 'friends' when I get home! That's big hearted, don't you think?

It has been cooler lately but we have had lots of rain and mud. I hate the rain because of the mud but would rather have mud than heat. When it is pouring rain on Sunday, it really cuts into our Meeting attendance because the members and investigators get drenched trying to get to the Church. Last week, there was hardly anyone at Meetings. Almost everything stops in Argentina when it rains. We are doing well though and staying busy.

We are working with 5 good families. Maria is a single mother with 7 kids. They all really like the Church and the family programs and the Chiodi family in the ward is working hard to fellowship them and help us teach them. Maria Urquiza and her boyfriend Alberto and Maria's 2 children have been coming to meetings and staying for the full 3 hour block. They plan to be married soon and we are hoping to set a baptism date for them after that. We are also working with a single woman named Analia Cazal. She is planning to be baptized in March. We have been working with Roberto Gonzalez and Veronica. They are 2 inactive members and just moved to our area. They have a baby named Diago. Roberto is an ex-missionary. He served in Chile, Santiago South. He has expressed a strong desire to come back to Church but needs to take care of some personal matters. We are hoping to be able to help him.

We were expecting 5 new investigators at Church Sunday and we waited and waited but no one came. My companion and I were very disappointed. It makes me sad when that happens. We took some comfort in Alma 26:27 "Now when our hearts were depressed, and we were about to turn back, behold, the Lord comforted us and said: Go amongst thy brethren, the Lamanites, and bear with patience thine afflictions, and I will give unto you success." Pres. Del Castillo has challenged us to read the Book of Mormon again before Easter. This time, I am reading it in Spanish. I am doing great and enjoying the work. I am pushing hard and trying to stay focused but I am excited at the prospects of seeing family again soon. But I know I will miss this place, the people and the work. Read the Book of Mormon every day. Please pray for me and I'll pray for you.

Dear Dana Ward — I presume you heard about our severe winter weather this month here in Dallas. Due to the snow and all, our power went out during the night. It continued snowing all day. The power came back on for 10 minutes, then went out for the rest of the day. A transformer blew up right outside our apartment. I hopped in the shower as soon as the lights came back on and got a quick shower but my companion had just gotten in when the lights went out for the second time, leaving him

stranded in the dark. It got really cold and super wet outside that day. The day before the bad storm, we had brought some wood home that we had found the previous day while we were out tracting. We were instructed to stay inside because of the extreme cold! Thankfully, we had a nice fire to keep us warm and the light from it to do our studying and planning.

The next day, we did venture out for a period of time but we didn't try riding our bikes in all that snow. We walked a good distance trying to get to our appointments and trying to locate people. As we walked around, the whole earth seemed to be covered in snow. We found a less active member we have been working with, trying to get him ready to go on a mission. We ran into him also walking down the street and asked him where he was going. He said he was headed for Burger King for lunch and invited us to go along. He had a friend with him and as we conversed with his friend, I asked him about religion and church and told him about Diego's church and how the church had made a difference in his life. He accepted our offer to teach him and asked us to explain what is so special about our church. He has 9 people in his family and we are hopeful we can start teaching them as well.

Saturday, we were out walking again because of the snow and the police stopped and asked us if everything was alright. We didn't know if it was because we looked suspicious or if it was because we were in a bad and dangerous area of town. But that day, we ended up teaching a less active member and also did some work around our own apartment.

I am being transferred but won't know my assignment until Monday. The mission president called and asked me to be a Zone Leader. I hate leaving this area where I have been serving for the last 6 months as a Zone Leader. Depending on the Zone I am placed in, it may overlap this same area. I'm anxious to find out the new assignment and where it will take me.

This has been a hard month. There are so many miracles ready to happen, but they all start with us and our faith. If we do not open our mouths, put our faith in the Lord and look for those miracles, they will never happen.

# PROGRESS REPORT ON THE GILA VALLEY TEMPLE

Keith Crockett has been called as the first president of the new Arizona Gila Valley temple. His counselors are Terry Bingham and Kent Woods. Pres. Crockett and his wife Kathleen, recently toured the temple which is still under construction and Sister Crockett described their visit as follows:

"Recently, we, the Temple Presidency and wives, had a wonderful experience visiting the Gila Valley Temple with Elder Walker, of the Seventy. Before we actually entered, the Temple had just been a dream on blueprints. As we stepped through the front entrance, I was overwhelmed with the feelings of majestic reality.

Men were working in nearly every room, laying marble floors and painting walls. In the Grand Hall that is behind the recommend desk and leads to the ordinance rooms, dressing rooms and the sealing rooms, there is beautiful cherry wood molding, doors and wainscoting on the walls. The walls are covered in an elegant off-white wall cloth. The ceilings are very high and some are painted already with beautiful designs in shades of light blue, sage green, a soft gold and metallic gold. The art glass windows have these same colors throughout the temple. When we looked into the Bride's room, the workmen were just removing a stencil from the ceiling. One of the workmen told us it had taken seven different stencils applied, painted and then peeled off to create the design on the ceiling. In this room, the molding, doors and wainscoting were white with different and beautiful wall cloth.

There are two ordinance rooms for the endowment sessions. In the first room, the

murals on the walls will be a panorama of our valley and the mountain. The next room contains the veil and leads into the Celestial Room which is very large. The ceiling is even taller with gold leafing on columns around the room. Just inside the front entrance is a very large waiting room for family members and friends unable to enter the temple.

The baptistery is on the east at the front and has a beautiful light blue glass tiled font. The oxen below are white. Marble floors were being laid.

It was just one year on Feb. 14<sup>th</sup> since the ground breaking. It is incredible that it will be ready for the open house in just two more months according to Brother Lowder, the project manager. The flowers for landscaping will arrive this week and be planted. All the trees were planted several months ago. We are also thankful for the nearly 200 workers already trained, from the Mesa and Albuquerque Temples.

It is such a testimony to me of the divinity of the Restored Gospel and the organization of the Church that we are able to have these marvelous facilities built and paid for with the tithing funds of faithful members who are willing to donate for the building up of the Kingdom of God here on earth."


