

Dear Dana Ward,

One of the greatest examples of 'Honoring a Father' is found in the Book of Mormon. The last two surviving righteous Nephites were Mormon, the great prophet general who compiled the Book of Mormon and gave it his name, and his son Moroni. We have the marvelous record kept by Mormon because his son Moroni, after his father's death, hid the record in a secret place. Before he buried the golden plates in the ground, Moroni wrote, "I, Moroni, do finish the record of my father, Mormon. Behold, I have but few things to write, which things I have been commanded by my father... I am alone. My father hath been slain in battle, and all my kinsfolk...and how long the Lord will suffer that I may live I know not. (Mormon 8:1, 5)

Later, he returned to the place where he had hidden the record and wrote, "I had supposed not to have written more, but I have not as yet perished." Then he declared. "And now I. Moroni, write a few words of my father Mormon." (Moroni 7:1) After wandering alone across the land, hiding from the enemies who would destroy him and thinking about the people who would find the record. Moroni chose to prepare a written account of the wise counsel that had been given by his father, Mormon. Thus, he preserved the record his father had compiled, and were it not for him, the whole Book of Mormon, including the savings of Mormon that Moroni contributed, would have been lost to us, the very people for whom he wrote.

Moroni added no more to the record after that, and so we suppose that he died somewhere alone, having kept his word to his father to



preserve the sacred records that became the Book of Mormon. We are all blessed because Moroni honored his mortal and Heavenly father.

As we celebrate Father's Day this month, may I take this opportunity to acknowledge the fathers, grandfathers and men of our Dana Ward who serve so diligently and provide so many examples of righteousness and dependability to the ward members, families and neighbors you serve. You are loved and appreciated as you fulfill your Priesthood obligations. We honor you!

I participated in my last baptismal service on Sat. May 29th. The parents, Daniel and Laura Grance were married Friday morning, the day before, then the family of 6 showed up for the baptism on Sat. And we baptized the parents and the 2 children that are over the age of 8. Their daughter Sophia will be 8 in August and will most likely be baptized by her father then. . They are such a golden family and are already involved in missionary work. They introduced a friend and her daughter to the Gospel and they have committed to baptism June 19th, which is wonderful, but will be after I have returned home. We have about 11 investigators we are teaching and last week, we held another "Tormenta Blanca" which was very successful. The ward members were invited to join us and team up with us to go out and try to make contact with the less-active members in the ward. I went with an 18 year old kid named Jose Maria. We contacted all the members on our list and even set a baptismal date with the daughter of one of the inactive families. We also found a less active member and his non-member Mother and brothers and sisters who have agreed to take the lessons. Hopefully, we can reactivate the one member while we prepare the rest of his family for baptism.

It seems wierd knowing this is the last letter I will be sending from the mission field. It is extremely cold here right now and I am about to make a big climate change. Tomorrow, I will be visiting and saying good-by to the ward members. Everyone wants to make food for me. I am going to come home nice and 'plumpy'. Wednesday, I will finish packing and we have to go pick up Elder Hyde's new companion from the bus terminal. Thursday, I travel to Resistencia where I will have my last interview with the Mission President. All of those who are going home will eat a last dinner at the mission home that night and then we hop on either the bus or a plane (I hope it is a plane) for the last trip to Buenos Aires. I fly out of Buenos Aires

Friday night, June 4, and will go by way of Dallas, Texas. Seventeen hours after leaving Buenos Aires, I should touch down in San Diego June 5th. I can only hug family members until I report to the Stake President, so anyone else will have to settle for a hand shake. I am sure I will shed a few tears when my name tag is finally removed from my shirt. But – I have high expectations to be able to serve as a member missionary when I get home. 
