Dear Dana Ward Members—

I'd like to share a story that's reported to have come from the missionary journal of Elder Scott Anderson:

"I was serving a mission in Germany. We had spent a long day knocking on doors when a lady invited us to come inside. That had never happened before. My companion said, "Do you know who we are?" "You want to talk about religion, don't you?" she said. "Yes, we do", explained my companion. "Oh, come in. I've been watching you walking around the neighbor-hood and I'm excited to have you here." She invited us into her study and as we sat down, she pointed to her three PhD certificates hanging on the wall. She had a degree in Philosophy, Theology, and European History specializing in Christianity. She pointed to a row of books on the shelf and told us that she had written all of them. She was a Theology professor at the University of Munich and had been teaching for 41 years. "I love to talk about religion", she said, "What would you like to discuss?"

My surprised but inspired companion said we'd like to talk about the Book of Mormon.

"I don't know anything about the Book of Mormon", she replied.

"Yes, I know", he said.

Twenty minutes later, we left her home. We had given her a Book of Mormon and our discussion was over. Now, eight and a half weeks later, I was standing in a small room filled with people and she was standing at the front of that room, dressed all in white. This Theology professor from the University of Munich stood up and addressed the small congregation and said, "Before I'm baptized I'd like to tell you my feelings. In Amos, chapter 8:11 it says there will be a famine of

the word of God. I've been in that famine for 76 years. I have three PhD's because I've been hungering for truth and have been unable to find it. Eight and one half weeks ago, two young men brought me a message. They were very nice and wonderful young men, but they didn't convert me. They couldn't because they don't know enough. But since that day, I have read the Book of Mormon, the Doctrine and Covenants, the Pearl of Great Price, all of Talmage's writings, books by John A. Widtsoe, and 22 other volumes of church doctrine. I wonder if you members know what you have."

Do we really know what we have in the gospel? The Church has made it possible for each of our testimonies to be read and felt all over the world. Through the Church's website lds.org, you can go to the missionary section and create an account and post your testimony. This is one of the easiest ways to share the gospel. February is the month of love. I would suggest that each of us create an account and post our testimonies. If you do not have internet access and would like to add your testimony, let a member of the bishopric know and we will get someone to help you. The Lord has said in D&C 62:3, "Nevertheless, ye are blessed, for the testimony which ye have borne is recorded in heaven for the angels to look upon, and they rejoice over you, and your sins are forgiven you." The Lord has said He would forgive sins if we bear our testimonies to those around us. It is my prayer that we each will take advantage of this great tool the Church has made available to us.

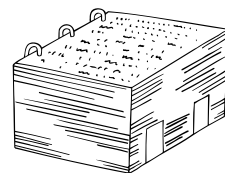

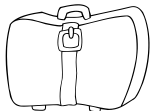

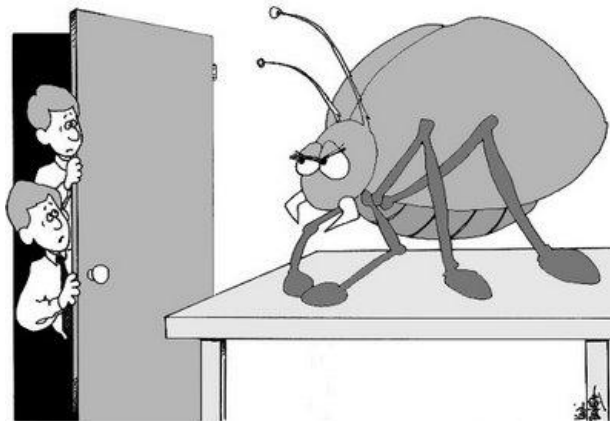

mission field for 17 months. Our two elders also work in the Acacia and Lazona Ward areas.

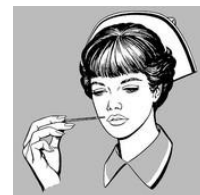

Sharon McCartney had gall bladder surgery and is home and recovering. Hope you feel better soon Sharon.

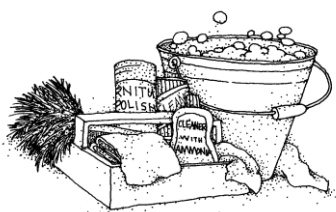

If you need help searching for your Ancestors, preparing Temple Ordinance Cards, or finding family histories, call our ward Family History Consultant, **Sister Christine Martin 835-6396**. She is always happy to help and is very good at finding your ancestors! New and fantastic changes and improvements are being made in the familysearch.org website. It's been a little confusing to some with the several sites for doing records research. The old familysearch.org and new.familysearch.org are all being integrated as fast as possible so that all available FREE records will be on one site. New resources are also being added as quickly as possible. Nearly three million new digital images were added just last week from Canada, Spain, Venezuela and the U.S. The U.S. Social Security Death Index of over 7 million records, has also been added. Everyone will have to register to access the site, but one and the same registration will allow you access to the LDS.org site as well as the familysearch.org site. An LDS registration will allow you to access information about temple ordinances. Non-members can soon register for a familysearch.org account to research the available records without access to the temple ordinance information. Once you have registered, the LDS.org site will also give you access to the Pueblo and Dana Ward official websites and the monthly calendars. Your registration number will automatically take you to our stake or ward site. LDS.org can also help you access ward directories or find directions to the nearest meetinghouse when away from home. You can access your patriarchal blessing, view upcoming events and even find and view personal study topics and build your own topic guide. You can compile related materials into your own "Study Notebook" from the "Tools" option on the homepage. There are also "Share" links that allow you to post selected content to Facebook, Twitter and even e-mail. If you need help getting registered, call Sister Martin.

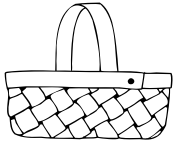

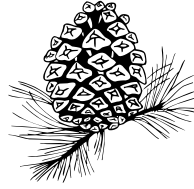

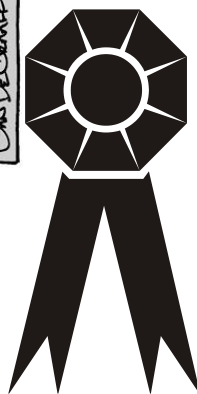
