## Missionary Mailbox




Elder Matthew G. Eyring Idaho Boise Mission 1111 S. Cole Rd. Boise, ID 83709-1869

#### Mountain Man Rendezvous

The Dana Ward Varsity Scouts participated in the Mesa District Mogollon Rendezvous held in March at the R-C Scout Ranch in Payson. A total of 850 Varsity Scouts and more than 300 leaders participated in 48 hours of games, learning and spiritual growth. **Adrian Ochoa**, 2<sup>nd</sup> Counselor in the YM General Presidency, Mark

Dietlein, member of the YM General Board and

David LeSueur Area Seventy over the North

America Southwest Area attended, were
speakers and participated in many activities with
the boys. Scouts from 140 Valley troops and a
few from Yuma and Texas attended. The
rendezvous is held every 2 years for 14 to 16
year old Varsity Scouts. It is a high adventure,
sports-oriented activity with a

Mountain Man theme incorporating mountain man trading games, demonstrations of strength and manliness, competition and classes. The scouts learned how to shoot black powder rifles, bull-riding on a 50 gallon

drum, blacksmithing, making ropes, making arrows, bead and leatherwork, primitive music, survival skills, knife throwing, archery, blow guns, primitive fishing, tracking, trapping and

game calling. Members of the Order of the Arrow dressed in Indian regalia and demonstrated traditional ceremonies of Native Americans. There was good food and a Dutch oven cook-off. Participants slept in teepees or lean-to style tents. The

boys were encouraged to dress the part, make and wear their frontier knife and parka-type shirts known as 'capotes'. Groups were judged on their authentic style clothing, mountain man style hats, medicine pouches, moccasins and leggin's and mtn. man type bags. No backpacks or fanny packs were allowed. The Mtn. Man era spanned from about 1820 to 1859 and included men like John Colter, Jedediah Smith and Kit Carson. Some of the Mtn. Men served as guides for the early Mormon pioneers as they were moving west into Utah and Arizona Territories. The boys also got to participate in jousting, a rope climb, log hoist and cutting logs with twomen bucksaws and the Saturday "John Colter Run". Pres. Ochoa not only demonstrated his superior knife throwing and roping abilities during the day, but at the Friday night fireside, he also shared his faith and testimony with the young men. Sheldon Hassell participated in this rendezvous as a member of the staff. He helped with the geo-caching where they used GPS coordinates to do a treasure hunting

game. Sheldon was impressed with the many things he learned at the event. He was particularly impressed with the phrase, "First the powder, then the ball" related to loading a black powder rifle. It was taught as a reminder of priesthood responsibilities and the importance of doing things in order. Kevin Hale and his Dad, Bishop Hale, were also on the staff and helped with the GPS activities. This was the 5<sup>th</sup> Rendezvous for Pat Rogers who attended with his son. Kimball. Garv **Tiffany** also went along as a ward leader. Brother Rogers was impressed with all the fun as well as spiritual experiences the boys had. Pat worked with Bishop Dixon of the Acacia Ward to assign the boys their 'medicine names' which were revealed at a campfire ceremony. The names were based on something the boys did in camp or their personalities. Kimball was named "Screaming Night Eagle", Sheldon Hassell was given the name "Deep Pockets" and Kevin Hale was "Road Rash". These names inspire a lot of speculation as to their origins. We will have to ask the boys individually to share the inspiration of their names. The Wallow fire that threatened the towns of Eager, Springerville, Alpine, Greer and Luna has destroyed over 50 homes. Missionaries serving in the danger areas were relocated to ShowLow. All Church members in the 9 affected wards and branches have been contacted and are safe. A 6 stake Dance Festival performance was scheduled to be held in the Round Valley Dome but the area was on 'stand-by' for evacuation depending on the direction of the fire and smoke. Although the dome filled with smoke the night before, officials were able to clear the smoke and the Dance Festival was held as scheduled with an audience of over 5,000. Three days later, Eager and Springerville were evacuated. No meeting houses have been damaged, however, the Church owned Camp Brentwood sustained some fire damage. The main building and cabins were spared but 3 trailers, a boat and some stereo equipment were destroyed. It is anticipated that the girls will be allowed to resume summer camp as soon as it is safe to go back in and general cleanup has been completed. During a fire in southeastern Arizona, the Bishop of one of the Douglas LDS wards, lost his home to the fire. We continue to pray for the safety and relief of

of residence for a shorter term of 6 or 12 months, but must pay for transportation costs to and from their field. Transportation costs for terms of 18 or 23 months will continue to be paid by the Church.

Local leaders responsible for senior missionaries will secure housing and pay all housing costs (including rent, utilities and furnishings). Missionary couples will then reimburse some or all of those housing costs up to the cap of \$1,400 per month. Missionaries from the US, Canada, Western Europe, Japan and Australia will be expected to reimburse the cost of housing up to the cap of \$1,400, or, if less, the actual amount for expenses. Those from all other countries will be expected to reimburse the costs up to their individual ability to pay, but not to exceed \$1,400 a month. All couples will continue to pay for food and other personal expenses.
