We are trying to be bold and share our message with everyone we meet while out walking. It is hard for me to be bold but we can see that it helps us be able to talk to a lot more people.

Our investigators are progressing really well. We invited 3 people to be baptized and are hoping they will set a date for baptism soon.

I love this work and I'm so happy to be a missionary.

Trevor has been in the Provo MTC for 3 weeks. On

Wednesday Aug 3rd he was sent to the Lima, Peru MTC for 6 more weeks of training - then off to Ecuador. Here are a few excepts of his letters from the Provo MTC.

Hola familia! the MTC is great! My companion Elder Anderson, is super awesome! We get along so well and I'm blessed to have him as a companion. We met our branch president and mission president and they called me to be the senior companion. I'm excited. We were taught how to pray in Spanish so that's how we pray now. It's cool.

There is an amazing spirit here and I enjoy it! All of our district is going to Mexico except Elder Anderson and myself. We are both going to Ecuador. All of us have no clue what our teacher is saying in class because we don't know Spanish yet, but we are learning. My companion. and I pray that we will have the strength and patience to learn the language. We study all the time; at breakfast, lunch, study time, class, language study, personal time, dinner, then we sleep. I've never read so much in my life! In the past few weeks I've probably read more than all of my senior year at Mesa High. (Maybe that would explain some of my grades that year.)

The spirit here is so strong. Saturday we had TRC which is us teaching investigators in Spanish, which was nerve racking. I finally had the blessing of the gift of tongues. We taught two lessons to investigators. The first lesson was nothing special, but when it came time to bear my testimony, I bore my testimony in perfect Spanish using words that I did not know. My companion said he has never heard me speak such good Spanish and was startled at my choice and use of words. Even more amazing was that in my head, my thoughts and impressions were all in Spanish and I knew exactly what they meant! It really strengthened my testimony to have the spirit with me while teaching. Our teacher, Hermano Hill, had counseled us the previous night, saying "When you teach, don't read off a piece of paper. Use the knowledge you know and trust in the Lord to give you the knowledge you don't know. You are entitled to

those specific blessings of the spirit." So that's what we did and that was the blessing that we received. We got Luis our investigator to commit to baptism next month. Luis is actually Hermano Hill but we teach Luis every other day, so we are starting to get the hang of it all. I love you all so much and I am very excited to go to Peru, then off to Ecuador! I want you to know that I know that this church is true. I love this gospel and I love the Savior more than myself. That's why I am here.

President Thomas S. Monson announced 15 July, 2011 the first temple to be built in France. A building site has not been selected as yet, but it will be somewhere on the outskirts of Paris. There are 35,960 members in France, 57 wards, 9 stakes and 2 missions. The first converts were baptized in 1849 and in 1952, the Church was granted status by the French Government. Not having their own temple the French Saints have had to travel to Zollikofen, Switzerland; Frankfurt, Germany; Copenhagen, Denmark or London, England, for their temple ordinances. There have been

several attempts to find a suitable site for the temple in France, but none was finalized. Church leaders are working to get the full authorization for completion of the French Temple. Although the local government approval process for the temple is still underway, French newspapers are already reporting Church plans to build at LeChesnay, near Versailles, prompting the announcement by Pres. Monson. More details will be announced soon.
