Update on Elder Kevin Hale:


We were able to talk to Kevin briefly while he had a lay-over in Miami before flying to Chile. He was very excited as he had a missionary opportunity on his flight from Salt Lake City to Dallas. He was seated next to a sister from Peru. They started a conversation in Spanish and she said she was in the States visiting one of her children and so her husband could receive some medical care. She recognized the missionaries (there were 21 missionaries on his flight) as she had been taught one lesson previously. Kevin and another sister missionary, Hermana Smith, then taught this sister for over two hours in Spanish. They taught her about the First Vision and the restoration of the priesthood. They found a pamphlet in Spanish that one of the Elders had and gave it to her. Then they taught her about prophets, baptism, and prayer. They

taught her to pray and helped her say a simple prayer with them. They also gave her a Book of Mormon in Spanish and read the Introduction and 3 Nephi 11 with her.

He was very focused on missionary work and after relating this experience, he said he had to go so other missionaries could use the phone. We haven't heard from him since he arrived in Chile and don't know when his preparation day will be, but we are anxious to hear where he was assigned and about his new companion.
