In the scriptures we hear the terms stand as a witness of God and Christ at all times and in all things and in all places. (Mosiah 18:9) This is very true today in the world we live in. President Monson has stated: "I've lived long enough to have witnessed much of the metamorphosis of society's morals. Where once the standards of the Church and the standards of society were mostly compatible, now there is a wide chasm between us, and it's growing ever wider." (General Conference 4/11)

Brothers and Sisters today we can see the chasm between the Lords values and moral standards and society's. May we all "let our light shine" and be a "witness of God" to those around us who don't share our moral values. We don't need to argue with society in social media, or talk down to others in any manner. But we should "stand steadfast and immovable" (1 Nephi 2:10) in our faith and standards and testify with love and charity to those around us. Talk about man creating God in his own image! Sometimes—and this seems the greatest irony of all—these folks invoke the name of Jesus as one who was this kind of "comfortable" God. Really? He who said not only should we not break commandments, but we should not even think about breaking them. And if we do think about breaking them, we have already broken them in our heart. Does that sound like "comfortable" doctrine, easy on the ear and popular down at the village love-in? (Elder Holland April 2014)

Brothers and Sisters the Lord needs us now more then ever to stand firmly in the gospel and boldly testify of the truths we have come to know and understand for ourselves. This I know to be true and testify of these truths in the name of Jesus Christ Amen.



7/13 So this past week I reached my year mark. Isn't that so crazy! Time really flies! Wow!

I had to give a talk yesterday on how repentance heals our souls. I sent you a copy of it but I didn't type it up. Sister Parke also sang I stand all Amazed in sacrament. She had to do it because she lost in a bet in a game of basketball with Steve. Everyone said we did a good job.

We finished a training we had to do for a app called Area book planner. It will have our planner on there as well as all our teaching records. It will all be on this app. We were informed today that that app will now be on our ipads. We will no longer have paper planners which will be weird. It's exciting though! All the info we need will be on this app.

On Tuesday we had our district meeting. It was all about working with members. I had to give a training on our relationships with members. I think it went well. I don't know what it is about this week but I gave two talks. The district meeting inspired us to figure out ways we can better work with members. It was so good! I have been out a year and still haven't figured out the best way to involve members. Haha! After the meeting we taught Tiffany Apperson, the one with the controlling husband and won't let her got o church. She still has an awesome testimony of the gospel and wants to come back to church. We taught her the restoration. She liked that she could get the gospel library app and that it has everything on it.

On Wednesday we went to the Twins game with lots of missionaries. We filled up a whole section of missionaries so that was pretty funny. There were a lot of white shirts and ties. We had more fun talking with everyone then we did watching the game. It was fun! It took like 30 minutes to find a parking spot though which made us a little late. All the parking garages were full. It was good to see Sister Young and others there. That night we met two guys outside their apartment and taught them a little bit. Their names are Jock and Tony. They said they were going to come to church but they didn't.

Thursday we had six set appointments right after the other. It doesn't usually happen like that so it was pretty cool. Only two canceled which was good. We taught Lesly. She is seriously so awesome and wants so badly to be baptized. We are praying for a miracle that her parents will have a change of heart. We also taught a girl named Madeline but she didn't have much time. We had a lesson with Kathy and she gave us some slippers she croqueted. They are so comfy. I will send you a picture of them.

7/6 On Monday after we stopped by some people we went and did service for Sister Erlendsson. That night we had a lesson with a recent convert, named Mercy. She is from Kenya. After the lesson we went tracting and met an awesome spanish buy about our age. We taught him the restoration and he seemed really interested in it. We set up a return appointment which he didn't keep. We can hopefully teach him and his family this week. It will be awesome if we can teach him again.

On Tuesday we taught Brad again, the one we met at Wendy's. He seemed to enjoy the plan of salvation. We helped him have more of an interest to read the book of mormon. He won't be able to come to church though for a few weeks. We also had a lesson with Amallia, the one we found when we had three miracles right in a row. The spanish sisters were able to come with and they taught pretty much the whole lesson in Spanish. I guess she got some anti info so wasn't sure about the book of mormon or Joseph smith. That night we stopped by some less-actives we had never met. One didn't want anymore contact from the church and wanted her records removed. The other one when she opened the door was talking really quitely. She said her husband is totally against us coming by. He thinks we are Jehovah's witness and that we are a colt. She quickly asked us to give her our number. We didn't think she was going to call but she did about ten minutes later. She was again whispering and asked if we could meet at the library on Thursday it was cool that we were able to meet her because she really does want to come to church.

On Wednesday we had interviews with President Forbes. Those went well! They are all very similar: he asks how we like our area, and companion and then asks if we have any questions for him. He doesn't usually say much more than that. It's kind of funny! After our interviews we ate at Snuffy's with Brother Longstreet as usual. Right before dinner we met a lady walking her dog. She asked us if we were the ones that visited with her last year but we weren't here at that point, she said she knew what we taught and wasn't too interested at first. We began teaching her about the restoration and she was getting into it and asking lots of questions. At one point she said she had goosebumps and we told her that was the spirit. We could both feel the the spirit very strongly so it was an awesome lesson with. We invited her to be baptized and set up a return appointment with her. We will see her again on Thursday. We had dinner with the Nebekers. Then we had a second dinner with Steve and Mary, the ones we met while they were out on their walk. They wanted to have us over for pizza and we were also planning on having a lesson with them. We were so full since we had two dinners. We taught them the restoration. They had a lot of good questions but they are still in a info stage stage. They didn't want to commit to reading the book of Mormon because they wanted to do more research on it. We hope they don't find any anti info about the church when they do their research. Hopefully we will be able to teach them again in a few weeks.

On Thursday we helped out at FMSC. Oh and I found out they have one in Mesa so I could go to it when I get home. We then went to meet Tiffany Apperson, the one that was whispering at the door. We were going to meet at the library but decided to take us out to lunch out of town so word wouldn't get back to her husband. He seems super controlling because he won't even let her go to church. She told us her whole story. Before she left the church she was taking temple prep but didn't want to go if she was going to go less-active afterwards. She wants to get back to church though. She said she can only go for and hour or two so her husband doesn't suspect she is going to our church. She also wants to meet with us weekly during her work hours so her husband won't know. she does a lot of driving for her job so she has a very flexible work schedule. I feel bad going behind her husbands back to teach her but she wants us to do it. It should be good for her though.

On Friday we had weekly planning and saw some less-actives most of the day. We watched The Testaments with a less-active, Sister Alden, and her grand-daughter(a non-member). They seemed to enjoy it. We also saw Brother Dam(Dom). He is Vietnamese and probably in his 70s. We see him each week. He translates a chapter from the book of Mormon from Vietnamese to English then he reads it to us. He already has it translated for when we come and he said it takes him four hours to do a chapter.

On Saturday we had a meeting with the bishop and went to help set up for a BBQ a member of the ward was putting on. Our p-day was switched to Saturday so we got to play. We went to the big barbeque at the Ashfords. They had quite a bit of the ward there and they provide all the meat. They only asked for 5 dollars per family to help pay for it. It was super good. I had some brisket with some of their homemade BBQ sauce. Then we spent the rest of the day with the Nelsons, whom we live with. Sister Parke took a nap while I watched them paddle board. Steve took his grand-daughters out on the board. They are 3 and 2. They just sat all nicely while steve paddled them around. Then we went and played tennis which I loved. Steve's daughter, son, daughter-in-law and their three children are in town so they came to play tennis as well. I beat his daughter Kelly but Steve beat me. It was fun though! Then we came home and made dinner. After dinner we all sat by the fire and talked until the fireworks started. We watched the fireworks right in their backyard. There were quite a few shows going on around the lake. It was so much fun! It was one of the best 4th of July celebrations. Oh and Sister Larson and Steadman came to their house as well. Sister Larson served here for awhile before I came. It was also fun to have them there with us. That was my week! This week is also another weird p-day because our actual p-day will be on Wednesday. All the missionaries, including our mission president, in the cities that are close enough are going to a twins baseball game on Wednesday so that should be fun. It makes for some odd p-days for the last two weeks. Next week should be a normal Monday p-day. Anyways, I love you all and hope you have a good week.

Hi, Highlights of the past 2 weeks. Our Self Reliance Conference in Valenzuela was very successful 14 from our District went to Valenzuela. I went to the class on learning how to interview. The teachers did an excellent job. The improvement of the members was noticeable as they role played. You could see their confidence get stronger. Some would go back and teach in their Ward or Branches, some are trying to get a better job than what they have now and some are trying to get a job period. Pres. Chavez fed us on our trip over (we had already had a hefty bowl of oatmeal before we left the house) then when we arrived they had chicken sandwiches. We had no room for those. Then they had lunch and before we left they had soup. We did eat lunch but had no room for the soup. They were very hospitable.

After getting back to town about 6:20pm we went to a Branch FHE. Elder Mabala and Cabral gave an excellent lesson on strengthening families. We then were honored to show them our family pictures and tell them a little about our family. They then had a game for us. They lined 10 people up in front of us and we were to remember their names. They said it was to help us learn the members names. If we got them wrong though we would be punished! Lol I told Elder Rogers to memorize all the 1's and I would memorize all the 2's that way we would only have 5 each. WRONG anyway, the punishment was eat Balut or dance the Chop Stick Dance. Poor guy looked like he would throw up before he even ate it. He opened his egg and it was totally gray! The members started to ask him if he was ok, as they could tell he looked sick. Then Pres. Pangilinan told him he didn't have to eat it and I told him he could go dance. Lol We made a memory that FHE for sure. Then...they ate dinner about 8:40pm we told them we were stuffed from the Self Reliance conference which was true. We left the house at 7am and got home about 10pm that day.

I think on Sunday I experienced my most embarrassing moment already! I forgot to wear my slip! I will just leave it at that. What was funny about it though as I snuck into Relief Society was this, they asked me to conduct the practice song and I said, "no not today." Then they said, "why Sister won't you conduct our song?" And I said after hesitating, "because I forgot to wear a slip today!" They cracked up laughing with me. Then they closed the doors and said to go up and conduct so, I did.

The 25th we went out with the Elders. We mostly did invitations to our Branch FHE to LA's. They tried to meet with one other as well but she was too shy to have us there with them. We also invited 1 part member family. Then we parked at Pochi's home. He was with us, and we walked down to the Marquez family. They have G'ma and 2 sisters with about 6 kids living there. We spoke about having Faith through our trials. Their G'ma is sick so maybe it benefited them there.

We had a great transfer day. We will Miss the Elders that left. I think Elder Rogers really misses Elder Mabala as he has gone around for 3 days saying "A ha!" like Elder Mabala did in our meetings when he was ready to move on in his lesson's. It makes me laugh.

I thought the FHE with Josie Thompson was well received. I felt the spirit myself more than once and as I looked at the members I saw some wipe their eyes. When the group got there they brought there equipment in and I reminded them they were not to film. They said they knew but, that they didn't leave it in the van. I couldn't blame them as it is expensive equipment. I have to apologizes as Pres Chavez was asked by them just minutes before it started if they could film. I had already told Pres. Chavez days earlier that we were not to have any audio or visual recording per Pres. Bertin. He gave them permission anyway. I am sorry. I did speak to some of the youth afterwards and they told me they felt the spirit as well. If it helped 1 person have more hope and faith in the Savior than it was well worth it.

We went out with the Sisters yesterday July 2nd. It is always good to visit the members. We taught about service.
